New Straps for Birch Veneer Cases

These small cases are in like-new condition, and I know they'll be a hit on Christmas morning, but when I got them home, I saw that the faux-leather ties were worn out and needed to be replaced.




When we were thrifting this past week, these small birch veneer cases caught my eye. When my companions moved on without buying the cases, I took them myself, figuring Santa would find them useful as stocking stuffers. They were marked \$1, but I got them for only 50 cents apiece on sale.



a closer look at the cases revealed that the repair will be relatively simple: the knob on the front of the case isn't

glued in place, but is attached to the flap by means of a tiny wood screw, with the tie strap caught between. All I had to do was to remove the knob and the old strap, insert the replacement strap, and reattach the knob. I just need to find something to use for a replacement.



To make the replacement straps, I decided to go with actual leather. Luckily I had a scrap on hand large enough to make the two straps I'd need.

I used my ruler and a rotary cutter to cut two narrow strips about 3/16" wide and long enough to wrap around the cases.

l used a small Phillips screwdriver to

remove the knob. I inserted the new strap between the knob and the veneer, then re-tightened the screw.

To fasten the cases, you just wrap the strap once around the case and then a couple of times around the knob to secure.





Even with the repair, these two stocking stuffers cost only \$1 total.

The repair itself was simple, since I had on hand all the things I

needed. The cases are really cute, and Santa has two very nice stocking stuffers to give out on Christmas Eve. No wonder he's smiling!
