## **Ouija Board Magnet**



I found several suitable images on line, and I couldn't decide which one I liked best, so I made multiples. I thought they were adorable as is, but it was my sister who came up with the ideal finishing touch!

The mini Ouija boards are fun on their own, but my creative sister suggested adding a tiny repositionable planchette . . . what a great idea.

I found a suitable image, then printed and cut several teeny planchettes from cardstock, which I backed with magnetic tape (the buttons themselves are sheet metal, so a magnet will cling nicely to them. Excellent!).












The magnetic tape is just right – strong enough to hold the planchette to the board, but not so strong that it's difficult to move around. The planchette is just the finishing touch these magnets needed!

I even found a round Ouija board image, and I couldn't resist making a magnet using my 3.5" button machine. DH particularly liked the round one, and surprised me by declaring that we must keep one of those ones for ourselves.
